

Post Office Saved!

JAMES Duddridge, MP for Rochford and Southend East, was pleased to join Charlie and Mohinder Bhogal to celebrate the news that the Post Office on Sutton Road had been spared from being closed down as part of an ongoing national programme to reduce the number of post offices.

James said, "I am overjoyed that the hard work put in by Charlie and Mohinder in running a vital community asset hasn't been ignored. Local people all over Rochford and Southend depend on our local Post Offices, and it is especially a lifeline for elderly residents."

The campaign to save the

Post Office involved a petition with over 1,000 signatures which James presented on the doorstep of Number 10, Downing Street. James also added his name to an Early Day Motion in the House of Commons which urged the Post Office to seek alternatives to the closure of existing branches.



Charlie Bhogal commented, "I want to thank all my customers who have been so supportive, as well as James Duddridge.

"We give a good service for the elderly people who can't easily get into the town centre... It is really fantastic news."

While the future of Sutton Road Post Office is secure for the moment, James is very much aware of the need to remain vigilant. As is evidenced by the sad loss of Post Offices elsewhere, there are no cast iron guarantees.

James reflected, "Whilst it is great news that Sutton Road is going to remain open, my own joy is tempered by the fact that other parts of the local community are losing out through this review. I would say to everyone currently using the Post Office on Sutton Road that they should keep on doing so, and encourage others to make use of it, because at the end of the day these small businesses are a big part of what helps to shape our local communities. They offer people the convenience of being close at hand and also somewhere to meet and interact with each other.


Local businesses hit by credit


SCORES of business owners sent in their responses to our last business survey. Now that the results have been collected we can reveal what the mood is amongst the business community within Rochford and Southend East.

- 61% of local business owners feel that local unemployment will go up within the next 12 months.
- 59% told us that their business has been hit by the recent credit crunch.
- 57% feel that local house prices are going to plummet whilst 78% are projecting that the taxes their businesses pay will increase.

Commenting on the results James had this to say, "Well firstly, I'm very grateful to all those who took time out of their working day to fill in the questionnaire; without this sort of first hand information it can be hard to form an accurate picture of what current business sentiment is.

"Secondly, it does concern me that there is such widespread pessimism currently being expressed by local businesses, and I worry what the effects of a prolonged economic slow down will do to both these businesses and the local people they employ. As the credit crunch rumbles on I pledge to examine any sensible measure to help sustain the livelihoods of those living in Rochford and Southend East."





Southend Driving Test Centre to close

ON 26th August James was informed by the Department for Transport that the Driving Standards Agency had taken the decision to close the driving test centre at Prittlewell Chase in Southend-on-Sea.

The Driving Standards Agency launched a joint consultation on the proposed closure of the Southend centre and the resulting purchase of a new site in Basildon in February 2008.

PETITION

By the time the consultation had closed on 9th May 2008, some 3,000 local residents had signed a petition to stop the closure of the local driving test centre. James also held an adjournment debate in the House of Commons on the subject in June along with his colleagues from neighbouring constituencies.

VOCAL OPPOSITION

Yet, despite the vocal opposition expressed by local residents and James at all levels of Government, the Driving Standards Agency have decided to ignore the concerns surrounding the closure of Southend's test centre. These were numerous, but specifically, that the new centre will mean learner drivers having to travel some ten miles to reach the new centre at Basildon. This breaks the Driving Standards Agency's own code of guidance which

states that towns with a population the size of Southend's should have access to a test centre no further than seven miles away.

James said, "It seems slightly ludicrous that, whilst we're all being told to rein in our use of cars and planes because of the damage they do to the environment, the Driving Standards Agency will now be forcing people to travel even greater distances just to take their driving test. Young drivers often use the roads around test centres to learn how to drive so they are best prepared for their test, the closure of Southend driving test centre will mean that they'll have to make a return journey to Basildon for each driving lesson. Not only is this bad news for local air quality but also for other drivers who already struggle with heavy congestion on the A127."



What makes the closure particularly galling is that, according to documentation filed with Basildon District Council, planning permission for the new test centre in Basildon was sought last December, many weeks before the consultation on the closure of Southend's centre was even due to start.

SERIOUS QUESTIONS

James commented, "Given this evidence, I'm really left with only one conclusion, and that is the public consultation, so widely touted by the Driving Standards Agency was nothing more than a sham, little more than a patronising show of concern from the Driving Standards Agency who had probably already made up their minds to close our local driving test centre. There are some serious questions to be asked about the consultation and specifically about when the developers were instructed to start building the new centre in Basildon and whether there will now be any changes to the building's design to accommodate the extra demand, given that Southend is to close. My suspicion is that there won't be because the Driving Standards Agency and their contractors have already built the centre with that extra capacity already in mind because they'd decided to close the Southend's driving test centre before the public consultation had finished."

So if you find yourself with a few minutes spare why not make sure you're on the electoral roll. It's especially important with European Elections coming up in June 2009.
