While at Prospects College, James and John Hayes met with Neil Bates, Chief Executive of the Prospects Learning Foundation where they toured the college and discussed the vocational training

courses available to young people. At South East Essex College, one of the largest colleges in the East of England, which caters for 14-19 year olds and adult learners, James and John Hayes met with Jan Hodges, Principal and Chief

Executive. They were shown plans for the merger of South Essex College and Thurrock and Basildon College and discussed some of the courses on offer to young people and adult learners in the area.

James said, "I am very grateful to John Hayes for travelling to Southend to visit some of our excellent further educational institutions with me. I know that John was very impressed with the number and variation of courses on offer in our area. Our further education colleges offer some fantastic opportunities for young people and adult learners to further their education and skills.

"Further education is really important and makes a real difference to young people to help kick-start their career and also gives adults the opportunity to learn new skills or retrain. Giving adults opportunities to retrain is particularly important in the current economic climate where many people are finding themselves out of work. By learning new skills, they have a much better chance of getting back into the workplace and finding a

Earlier this year, James and local volunteers delivered a Law and Order survey to a number of residents in Shoebury.



Local MPs want accurate Census for Southend

JAMES Duddridge and David Amess, MP for Southend West, have raised the importance of an accurate census in 2011 in a debate in the House of Commons in order to raise their concerns with the

The population figures from the census are used to determine the amount of local government funding allocated and due to errors in the 2001 Census, Southend has been getting insufficient funding which has a detrimental effect on local services.

Southend Council believe that there was an undercount of approximately 17,000 people and the Office of National Statistics calculate that every 1,000 people undercounted equates to a loss of £500,000 per annum in grants. The Council therefore estimate that because of the undercount of population, Southend has lost out on £8.5 million each year since

Since James was elected in May 2005, he has been working closely with David Amess MP, Southend Council and the Office of National Statistics to ensure that the 2011 census is successful.

The next national census is less than two years away on Sunday 27th March 2011.

James said, "An accurate census in 2011 is vital for Southend and it is vital that next time accurate information is recorded. As a result of the 2001. information is recorded. As a result of the 2001 census, Southend has been ripped off and I will continue to press for an accurate census to ensure fair funding for Southend.

'It is also vital that awareness about the census is increased and that people know about the importance of the census, as it has such a significant impact on Southend's future.
